TOOL 5 — Spiritual Leadership Worksheet

PART 1 — KEY CONCEPT COMPREHENSION

This module calls every husband back to the spiritual responsibility no one else in the home can fulfill on his behalf. Most husbands delegate it by default — not by decision. Answer based on what you read.

1. The module says spiritual leadership begins with your own walk, not your family's obedience. Before you can disciple your children, you must be a disciple. Honestly describe the current state of your personal walk with God.

2. Family devotions, prayer, Scripture, and spiritual conversation in the home are the husband's domain by assignment. A wife who carries this alone has not been empowered — she has been abandoned. Who currently carries the spiritual weight of your home?

3. The module says spiritual leadership protects the home from what is invisible — through intercession, prayer, and addressing spiritual drift. When did you last pray specifically for your wife and children by name? What is your practice of spiritual covering for your family?

4. Research shows a father's spiritual engagement is a stronger predictor of a child's long-term faith than the mother's. What is your level of spiritual engagement currently producing in your children? What do you want it to produce?

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PART 3 — CASE STUDY REFLECTION — MARCUS AND DIANE

Marcus began leading a ten-minute family devotion every morning before school. The first week his sons rolled their eyes. The second week they stopped resisting. By the third month his eldest son came to him privately and said he wanted to be baptized. Marcus had not preached a sermon or taught a theology class. He had simply showed up every morning with his Bible and his presence. That consistency produced something no program could have produced alone — a son who had seen faith lived, not just declared.

5. Marcus's son asked for baptism because he saw faith lived consistently — not declared. What is your children's current experience of faith in your home — lived or declared? What needs to change?

6. Marcus started with ten minutes. Consistency produced more than content. What is one specific, sustainable spiritual practice you will begin in your home this week — small enough to start, significant enough to matter?
